### Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) Inspection

All Church of England and Methodist schools are inspected approximately every five years by a SIAMS inspector from the Church of England. Our school will be inspected tomorrow, Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2024. A SIAMS inspection is an opportunity to highlight the impact that the school's Christian vision has on the flourishing of the whole school community. As part the inspector's evidence-gathering she will speak with a range of people including children and parents. Following the inspection, she will write her report. Once it is finalised it will be published, approximately three weeks after the inspection. The report will celebrate all that is special about our school and will identify the next steps that are helpful in our ongoing development as a Church school.

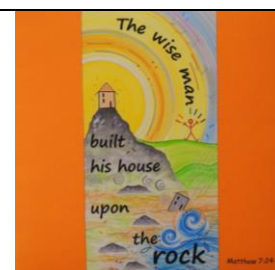
**Punctuality** The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time.

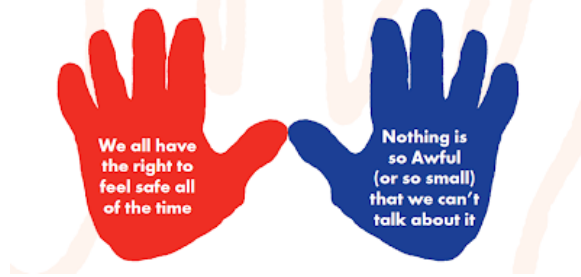

# Should I keep my child off school?

## Yes

### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

## **Measles cases in West Midlands**

**There are still cases of measles. Please ensure you remain vigilant.**

Currently Warwickshire has no confirmed cases, however we wanted to make you aware of the available resources:

We hope you find this information useful. If your child is unwell and you suspect it may be a case of measles, you **MUST** contact your GP. Your child **MUST** remain away from school for a minimum of 4 full days.

**If your child has not had their MMR Vaccination and you would now like them to, or you are unsure if they should, please contact your GP to get this booked in or to discuss the vaccination with a medical professional.**
