Teach the children the song, 'My Bonnie lies over the ocean', referring to the Teacher notes: Folk song lyrics for the words and the Teacher video: Folk song for the tune and instructions. Explain to the children that this topic is all about the British Isles.	Dynamics, pitch, structure, texture, timbre

7	To evaluate and improve a group composition	Journey through Britain Pupils combine their learning from the previous lessons to compose a piece of music that takes them on a journey through Britain, from the seaside to the countryside to the city.
