

We will also be learning about:

- -Taking care of our environment focussing on plants, flowers and minibeasts
- -Taking care of all living things
- -Exploring feelings in stories such as the angry ladybird and exploring how characters feel in traditional tales such as Jack and the Beanstalk -daily 'Golden' behaviours of the day and
- -daily 'Golden' behaviours of the day and making the right choices.

- Nursery will be working on Phase 1 activities from letters and sounds. This will include daily activities such as:

Listening walks and talking about sounds in the environment such as birds tweeting and bees buzzing.

Playing different musical instruments and using words such as 'loud' and 'quiet' to talk about the sounds.

Join in with songs, rhymes and stories.

Moving to music such as wiggling like a worm and flying like a butterfly.

Communication and Language



During this term we be encouraging all children to share their ideas and join in conversations about what they are learning.

Communication and language is embedded across all areas of the curriculum and adults will support children:

- -To listen to others, talk and ask questions of others.
- -To listen to stories with increasing attention and recall.

Physical Development



- -Weekly Gymnastics with Mrs Gill
- -May Pole Dancing and celebrations
- -Daily outdoor learning opportunities such as rolling tyres, riding bikes, large movements with the ribbons and chalk etc.
- -Fine motor activities such as threading, buttons, zips, using tweezers etc
- -Using small equipment such as the scissors and knives to cut fruit.
- -Dress and undress in coats and boots.
- -Dress and undress for P.E

Playing rhyming games such as bee and knee or bug and rug.

Talking about sounds (phonemes) at the beginning of words such as 'b' for butterfly.

Matching words that begin with the same sound (phoneme) such as bee and butterfly.

Reception will be working on **Phase 3** activities from letters and sounds. This will include daily activities such as:

Recapping Phase 2 set of letters

Segmenting and blending words to read and write

Reading and writing tricky words

Reading and writing captions

Learning the alphabet song

Writing new letters (graphemes)

Reading and writing digraphs (two letters together making one sound)

Reading and writing high frequency words

Reading and writing sentences

Reading and writing two syllable words

- -To join in repeated refrains and anticipate key events and phrases in rhymes and stories.
- -To understand and respond to 'why' questions such as 'why did the caterpillar get so fat?
- -To ask 'who, what, why, how' questions.
- -To use language to imagine and recreate a range of roles and experiences in play situations.
- To learn new topic words.
- -To hold and follow conversations, as well as provide a related response.
- To describe what they can see.
- To use sentences when speaking.
- -To understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important.
- · Learn new vocabulary.
- · Use new vocabulary through the day.
- Engage in story times.
- Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.
- Listen carefully to rhymes and songs, paying attention to how they sound.
- · Learn rhymes, poems and songs.
- Engage in non-fiction books.

- -Regular handwriting/letter formation sessions.
- -Dough disco.
- -Cosmic Yoga.
- -Learning about own health and self-care skills, needs and hygiene through looking at the occupations of a dentist/nurse/hair dresser/etc.
- -Teeth brushing.
- --Learning to eat a healthy range of foodstuffs and understands need for variety in food by looking at healthy eating and having a balanced diet.
- -Lots of food tasting to take place.
- -tasting different fruit from around thr world.
- -Designing a healthy lunchbox for the hungry caterpillar.

Learning about growing and changing linked to the caterpillar changing.

-Moving like different minibeasts such as sliding, slithering and flying etc



As well as phonics daily, we will be learning other	
reading, comprehension and writing skills through	
other activities such as:	
- writing for different purposes such as shopping	
lists, taking the register, labelling plants and	
vegetables in the allotment, labelling minibeasts etc.	
-Finding out about our topic using information books.	
We will ask questions and find out the answers. Eg	
what do plants need to grow?	
-Handwriting	
-Nursery will take part in weekly write dance	
sessions, where they move different writing tools	
such as crayons to music and make patterns	
-lots of phonics games	
-Exploring different letters, words and logos/signs	
-segmenting and blending phonemes using our robot	
arms	
-Recalling and recording stories using story maps	
and mountains	
-lots of Mark making using different patterns such	
as zig zags, lines and circles	
- pencil grip activities and exercises to strengthen	
our hands and fingers	
-Reading a range of words, sentences and books.	
-Lots of small play- using puppets, props and other	
resources to retell and make up our own stories	
-writing labels for plants, flowers and beanstalks	
-Drawing lifecycles and labelling	

- -writing simple poems
- -writing shopping lists and recipes for pancake day
- -- Individual reading sessions
- -Guided Group reading sessions
- -Weekly Library sessions
- Daily storytelling and singing
- -Lots of name writing
- -Writing cards for special events such as Easter and Mother's/carers day

Mathematics



- -Lots of counting such as the fruit counters and spots on ladybirds etc.
- -Measuring such as the height of the beanstalk/flower
- Positional language
- Encourage children to explore and compare different weights and capacities
- -Counting and recording.
- -Counting forwards and backwards.
- -Collecting and sorting natural objects according to their shape, size or colour.
- -Look at and begin to identify numbers and shapes.

Understanding the World



-RE Unit: Which times are special and why?

We will be learning about which times are special through the following activities:

- -making a celebration tub with items from different celebrations such as Christmas, Easter, Diwali etc.
- -Easter Celebrations
- -Talking about different celebrations important to the children and their families.

Expressive Arts and Design







- -Weekly music lessons with Mrs O'hagen.
- -Tapping out rhythms.
- -Noticing patterns in the environment.
- -Using natural resources to make pictures, models and collages.
- -Printing with seasonal fruit and vegetables.
- -Singing and finding out about nursery rhymes.
- -Drawing and painting.
- -Junk modelling
- -Construction activities of building.
- -Sensory activities e.g. glitter, sand, paint, playdough, etc.

- -comparing different sizes and weights of objects using scales and other equipment.
- -Making Pancakes- counting ingredients and using words to describe eg 'more', 'add', 'full'.
- -Measurement- measuring plants that are growing- big and small, long and short. How are they changing?
- -Measuring length such as different worms and caterpillars.
- -Sorting and problem solving.
- -Patterns, colours and shape patterns.
- -Number rhymes.
- -Match number cards with groups of objects.
- -Addition and subtraction problem solving.
- -Noticing and talking about patterns such as veins on leaves, and petals, spots on a ladybird and stripes on a caterpillar.
- -looking at symmetry on butterflies

- -To explore and find about a Jewish festival-Sukkot.
- -Garden centre role play areas.
- -Fruit and vegetable shop role play.
- -Curiosity cube with interesting items linked to the topic eg a bulb, gardening tool... children ask questions to find out what it is.
- -Investigation station so children can carry out science experiments such as regrowing vegetables and exploring roots and shoots etc.
- -Allotment in the tuff trays with different gardening tools and natural materials.
- -learning about and exploring fruit and plants from all around the world...make links to Handa's Surprise and other books.

- -Naming and mixing colours.
- -Making models using playdough and clay.
- -Focus Artist: Giuseppe Arcimboldo We will learn all about this artist and create our own pieces of art using the same techniques such as:
 - Exploring the texture and colours of different fruits
 - Observational drawings of natural materials
 - Using real objects to create self portraits eg pasta, fruit and natural materials.
 - Recap how Andy Goldsworthy used natural materials to create art.
 - Learning about drawing our faces and using line and shapes to create a face or body.

- counting and sorting the fruit that the hungry caterpillar eats.
- -Using words such as more and fewer to compare amounts.
- -Caterpillar repeating patterns.
- learning the days of the week linked to the Hungry caterpillar.
- -Planting seeds and bulbs and noticing them change
- -Using our senses to explore the natural world- What can you see? Hear? Smell?
- -Seasons and weather-what is changing? How do you know?

- -woodland walks to explore the seasons and plants/flowers
- -Minibeast trail

- -Learning about what Shrove Tuesday is and how it is celebrated.
