2	LG; what do Jesus' actions teach Christians	<ul> <li>What do Christians believe happened on Easter Sunday?</li> <li>Explore art of disciples washing Jesus' feet. Retell John 13:4 - 17.</li> <li>Task: chn have outline of foot and reflect on Jesus washing the disciples' feet teaches Christians.</li> </ul>	
3	LG: remembering the Last Supper	Experience a series of foods that would have been shared at Passover Retell story of the Last Supper from Matthew 26:17-25.  Task: match pictures of the Last Supper	
4	LG: understanding Holy Communion	Christians take communion (mass or Eucharist) regularly. 	questions	Matthew 26:31-75. Use artwork ('Peter's Denial' by Indian Christian artist Frank Wesley) to	
		generate questions and answers What is happening? How are people feeling? What are they	
		thinking? How do you know?	
		Task: annotate painting with own questions and answers.	
7	LG: what would I stick up for?	Tell the story of Brother Andrew smuggling Bibles into Romania: www.opendoorsusa.org/about-	
		us/history/brotherandrews-	
		story . Imagine that Christianity has become illegal in Great Britain. Chn to think about things that	
		are so important for them, they would stand up for those beliefs no matter who disagreed with	
		them.	
		Task: in pairs the arrange cards they are 'most likely to stick up	
		for' at the top and 'least likely to stick up for' at the bottom.
