1	<p>I can find out what Philosophy is.</p>	<p>Warwickshire Agreed Syllabus - Where do people turn for guidance in life?</p> <p><u>What is Philosophy and what does it tell us about how to live well?</u></p> <p>Introduce wonderful world of philosophy by sharing book Q is for Question - an ABC Philosophy by Tiffany Poirier.</p> <p>Share poem H is for Happiness - discuss poem by using a dialogue web.</p> <p>Big questions in a question jar such as, What was there at the beginning? Do we need night? How do we know what is right or wrong?</p>	<p>Philosophy, Guidance, Non-religious, Humanism, Bible, Torah, Qur'an, Guru Granth Sahib, Guru, Waheguru, Ik Onkar, Mool Mantra, Angels, Spiritual</p>

		<p>Read book <i>Happiness with Aristotle - Big ideas for little philosophers</i>. What is a philosopher? Reflect on what the word wisdom means.</p> <p>Introduce the concept of guidance. Where might you turn for guidance in life?</p>	
2	<p>I can identify where non-religious people turn to for guidance.</p> <p>Tolerance</p>	<p>Warwickshire Agreed Syllabus - Where do people turn for guidance in life?</p> <p><u>Where do non-religious people turn to for guidance?</u></p> <p>God is no longer the source of guidance for everybody in society.</p> <p>Introduce Humanism. Use the book <i>My Humanist Family from the 'Belonging and Believing' series by Gill Vaisley</i> to explore what Humanism is.</p> <p>Where is Wilf getting his guidance from? How might he behave in a result of this?</p> <p>Mini classroom hunt to find sources of guidance about how we should behave and work at school.</p> <p>This might include school rules, signs etc.</p> <p>Ten Commitments activity - see resources.</p>	
3	<p>I can identify where people with Abrahamic worldviews turn to for guidance in life.</p> <p>Respect</p>	<p>Warwickshire Agreed Syllabus - Where do people turn for guidance in life?</p> <p><u>Where to people with Abrahamic worldviews turn to for guidance in life?</u></p> <p>Abrahamic Worldviews: Lesson 1.</p> <p>Explore the story of Noahs Ark told in the Torah and the Old Testament.</p>	

		<p>Pupils consolidate their knowledge of the story by completing a simple sequence activity and retelling the story (See SACRE resources).</p> <p>Abrahamic Worldviews: Lesson 2.</p> <p>Explore story of The Ark of Nuh as told in the Quran. Invite children to be detectives comparing the two versions (the Jewish/Christian one and the Muslim one). Children make note of similarities and differences between each version.</p> <p>What do the stories tell us about what God is like? How does this story guide people today?</p>	
4	<p>I can explain how the New Testament is a source of guidance for Christians.</p> <p>Respect</p>	<p>Warwickshire Agreed Syllabus - Where do people turn for guidance in life?</p> <p><u>How is the New Testament a source of guidance for Christians?</u></p> <p>Recall that the Bible is split into two parts - Old and New Testament. The New Testament contains lots of stories about Jesus, his life and teachings. What is a Parable? A story told by Jesus that contains a hidden message. These messages guide many Christians on how to live in a helpful and happy way.</p> <p>Explore the parable of the Good Samaritan.</p> <p>Display the Christian version of the Golden Rule: You should love your neighbour as you love yourself. Pose the question: Who did and who didn't follow the Golden Rule in the parable of the Good Samaritan?</p>	

		Consider how the parable might guide Christians today. (See SACRE resources for worksheet). Reflect on sub question for this lesson.

5	<p style="color: red;">I can identify where people with Sikh worldviews turn to for guidance in life.</p> <p style="background-color: yellow;">Tolerance</p>	<p>Warwickshire Agreed Syllabus - Where do people turn for guidance in life?</p> <p><u>Where do those with Sikh worldviews turn to for guidance in life?</u></p> <p>Tell the pupils that the Sikhi is 500 years old and has 25-30 million followers worldwide. Use the book <i>My Sikh Family from the Belonging And Believing series by Gill Vaisey</i> to investigate a Sikhi worldview. Meet Krishan using the front cover then read page 1-6.</p> <p>Pause on page 5 and explore the photo. What are they wearing? Explain the kara is a circular steel band that has no beginning and no end to symbolise the Sikh view of God.</p> <p>Pause to reflect on page 6 - 'We believe there is only one God, who is the creator of everything in the world' Another name which many Sikhs use for God is Waheguru, which means Wonderful Lord.</p> <p>Display symbol Ik Onkar - means there is only one God.</p> <p>Read page 10 - explaining that over a long period of time there were 10 gurus (teachers) who gave messages of wisdom and guidance from God.</p> <p>Today we are going to focus on Guru Nanak, who</p>	

		<p>founded the Sikh faith and was famous for spreading the message of Gods oneness and universal love.</p> <p>Read story Nanak Goes to Market and use images to retell story (SACRE resources).</p> <p>Discuss Guru Granth Sahib - teachings of the Ten Gurus have been gathered into the scriptures called the Guru Granth Sahib.</p> <p>Show images (SACRE resources).</p> <p>Reflect on the sub question for this lesson.</p>	
6	<p>I can describe how a belief in angels can affect people's behaviour choices.</p> <p>Respect</p>	<p>Warwickshire Agreed Syllabus - Where do people turn for guidance in life?</p> <p><u>How might a belief in angels affect people's behaviour choices?</u></p> <p>Exploring the role of angels that record the good and bad deeds humans do in Muslim worldviews.</p> <p>Show image of Metatron. Some people with Jewish worldviews (and some Christian) believe that a powerful angel called Metatron teaches people how to use their spiritual power for good while he records their choices in the universe's great archive.</p> <p>Read My special Angels - The Two Nobel Scribes by Razana Noor.</p> <p>Discuss the job of the 'The Two Scribes' in the Islamic tradition.</p> <p>Give children a resource sheet with two angel outlines. Pupil draw/write example of deeds the</p>	

		angels may be recording, good deeds inside the angel and bad deeds outside the other. Who /what helps you to make good choice?
