






Book Fair

SCARF Programme

This Thursday and Friday 19th & 20th March, the Coram Life Education team are coming to deliver their SCARF programme to the children at All Saints. SCARF stands for **Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience and Friendship**. SCARF is a whole school approach which enables us to build on these essential foundations for our children from the Early Years (Nursery and Reception) all the way through to Year 6.

Attendance and Punctuality for week beginning 9th March 2026

If your child is unwell and not able to attend school, you must inform us, either by calling the office and leaving a message via the absence line or sending a message via MyEd app, before 9am. Please keep your child at home if they have a temperature of 38 or above. For sickness and diarrhoea, children must remain absent from school or nursery for 48 hours after the last episode.

Punctuality The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time. First thing in the morning is the most crucial time of the day when children settle in and find out what they will be doing that day. All children in all year groups are learning to support their reading first thing every morning, whether that be phonics or practising spellings. Arriving late for school can have a massive impact on your child's education, particularly their literacy skills, and their wellbeing.

School Dinners

From 1st April 2026 the new prices for school dinners will be **£3.25** for the Summer Term, the weekly fee will be £16.25. When we return to school in September school meals will be charged at £3.50 per day.

From April we will have four choices available each day – have a look at the new, improved menu on the school website.


Communications

Self-Care

Self-care is all about the little things we do to help ourselves feel better or to keep ourselves feeling good. This is a great way to look after our mental health and wellbeing. Self-care involves 'checking in' with yourself and thinking "how do I feel today?" and understanding "what do I need today?" Self-care looks different for everybody. What works for one person may not work for someone else!

Our tips for self-care:

- **Taking** time-out when we are feeling overwhelmed.
- **Making** time for an activity which makes us feel good e.g., taking a bath, listening to music, going for a walk, or playing a game you enjoy.
- **Doing** the basic things to look after ourselves e.g., eating and sleeping well.
- Practise self-care by asking yourself the questions in the box below:

How do I feel today? What do I need today? Do I need physical or mental self-care? When can I add self-care into my day? Make time to do it! Repeating these Self-Care check-ins at least once each day can help improve our mental health.
