Attendance and Punctuality for week beginning 19th January 2026

If your child is unwell and not able to attend school, you must inform us, either by calling the office or sending a message via MyEd app, before 9am. Please keep your child at home if they have a temperature of 38 or above. For sickness and diarrhoea, children must remain absent from school or nursery for 48 hours after the last episode.

Punctuality The school gates open at 8:45am & close at 8:55am please arrive on time.

First thing in the morning is the most crucial time of the day when children settle in and find out what they will be doing that day. All children in all year groups are learning to support their reading first thing every morning, whether that be phonics or practising spellings. Arriving late for school can have a massive impact on your child's education, particularly their literacy skills, and their wellbeing.

- **95 minutes** of learning time was lost due late arrivals. 4 year groups had all of their children in school on time every day last week.


