British Science Week

To celebrate British Science Week 8th – 17th March 2024 we have a fabulous, exciting day planned with a visit from real scientists next

Easter Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

The HAF programme provides activities during the Christmas, Easter and Summer holidays. A HAF code will give access to a maximum of 4 session during the Easter holidays for children who receive benefits-related free school meals from Reception through to Year 11. This programme is entirely separate from the Local Welfare Scheme’s household support funding (HUGGG vouchers).

Should I keep my child off school?



Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Measles cases in West Midlands

If your child has not had their MMR Vaccination and you would now like them to, or you are unsure if they should, please contact your GP to get this booked in or to discuss the vaccination with a medical professional.
