#### **Easter Celebrations**

### **Easter Creations:**

All children in all year groups are invited to make something for Easter. It could be an Easter Garden; decorate a bonnet or hat, decorate a hardboiled egg or create a piece of artwork. All creations MUST be a child's own work. Children are welcome to make one piece which must be named, they will receive a small Easter chocolate / sweet for participating. Please ensure all creations are brought in to school no later than tomorrow morning, **Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> March**. The creations will be judged by visitors to the school, there will be one winner from each class who will win a larger Easter treat.







Children in Nursery, Reception, year 1 and year 2will be participating in our School Council annual **Easter Egg Hunt** on **Wednesday.** If you have not yet paid, the cost to enter is **£2.50** each child, payment can be made in the office or via the MyEd App.

Families are invited to join us for our Easter Parade on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> March at 9.00am. We will also have our Easter Story Scenes on display in the hall.



On **Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March** we will be having an iSingPOP day. This will consist of Lent singing workshops, and a singing celebration assembly for all year groups.

# **Easter Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme**

The HAF programme provides activities during the Christmas, Easter and Summer holidays. A HAF code will give access to a maximum of 4 session during the Easter holidays for children who receive benefits-related free school meals from Reception through to Year 11. This programme is entirely separate from the Local Welfare Scheme's household support funding (HUGGG vouchers).

#### <u>Pets</u>

Many of our All Saints' families and staff have pets that we love who are part of our families. These come in all varieties from fluffy cats and dogs to exotic snakes and lizards.

However, we have noticed that some of our children and families are quite nervous around dogs when they are brought to the school gates to meet children. This area is quite narrow and it can be difficult for children and families to walk past without being closer than they are comfortable to be to the dogs. We are not concerned that your pets are dangerous, but in order to make sure that everybody feels comfortable, if you bring your dog for a walk to school in the morning, or at home time, please wait at the end of the school drive in Knebley Crescent, rather than at the school gate. This will allow everyone to enter or leave school comfortably.

# Free Level 1 Scooter Training – Easter Holidays

Warwickshire County Council and Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership are offering FREE Level 1 Scootability training throughout Warwickshire during the Easter holidays, 25th – 29th March. We would be most grateful if you could share the below information, and attached poster, direct with parents/carers:

Warwickshire County Council and Warwickshire Road Safety Partners are offering free Scootability Level 1 training throughout Warwickshire during 25th – 29th March. Training is suitable for children aged 5 – 10 years and is being held at the following locations:

### • Monday 25th March: Pingles Leisure Centre, Avenue Road, Nuneaton.

• Thursday 28th March (pm): Atherstone Memorial Hall, Long Street, Atherstone

During the course, children will learn essential skills and knowledge to help them scoot safely, including:

- learning about the parts of the scooter and the safety gear
- learning the basics of pushing, balancing and turning
- learning how to do slow and fast stops
- learning how to navigate stationary and moving obstacles
- learning how to do one handed signalling
- learning about road safety rules

All equipment, including scooters, helmets and pads, is provided and the sessions are suitable for children aged 5 to 10 years.

Booking is needed and spaces are limited.

Please note that this training is for push scooters only and not suitable for e-scooters. As a reminder, it is currently against the law to ride a privately owned e-scooter in any public place in the UK, this includes Warwickshire Country Parks.

If your child has not had their MMR Vaccination and you would now like them to, or you are unsure if they should, please contact your GP to get this booked in or to discuss the vaccination with a medical professional.

# Should I keep my child off school?

	Until
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
