Head Lice & Nits

Head lice and nits are very common in primary school children. They are not caused by dirty hair, and are picked up by head-to-head contact. Head lice can make your head feel itchy. The only way to be sure someone has head lice is by finding live lice. You can do this by combing their hair with a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb). You can buy these online or at pharmacies

It is recommended that you do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched headlice, and to check that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17. You cannot successfully remove all of the lice in 1 treatment. You cannot prevent head lice.

Attendance and Punctuality for week beginning 17th November 2025

Please remember – if your child is unwell and unable to attend school, you must inform us, either by calling the office or sending a text message via our MyEd app, before 9am. Please keep your child at home if they have a temperature of 38 or above. For sickness and diarrhoea, children must remain absent from school or nursery for 48 hours after the last episode.

Punctuality The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time. First thing in the morning is the most crucial time of the day when children settle in and find out what they will be doing that day. All children in all year groups are learning to support their reading first thing every morning, whether that be phonics or practising spellings. Arriving late for school can have a massive impact on your child's education, particularly their literacy skills, and their wellbeing.

School Uniform

Our school has a uniform, which is designed to be comfortable, serviceable, affordable and smart. The expectation at All Saints is that all children wear the uniform listed below. Uniform should be clean and labelled with your child's name. School take no responsibility for lost items.

School uniform can now be ordered online from the school office. It is also available from our local school uniform stockist The School Wear Centre in Nuneaton town centre.

Uniform

- √ Plain royal blue sweatshirt (with or without school logo)
- √ Plain royal blue cardigan (with or without school logo)
- ✓ Plain white polo shirt, white shirt or blouse (no designer logos please)
- ✓ Plain grey tailored trousers (no leggings, jeans, combat style or skinny)
- √ Plain grey skirt knee high (no more than 2" above or 2" below the knee)
- √ Plain grey tailored shorts
- √ Blue and white checked or striped summer dress, playsuit or shorts
- ✓ Plain black footwear suitable for playground and indoor use, black flat ankle boots can be worn during winter months which must go under trousers,
- √ Plain royal blue fleece with school logo (outdoor use)

P.E. Kit

Indoors:

- ✓ Plain white T-shirt
- ✓ Plain black shorts, leggings, joggers or skort
- √ Plimsolls/trainers
- √ Swimsuits/trunks and towels for swimming lessons.

All children have at least one PE lesson a week. Children will come to school wearing their PE kit on their year group's designated day for PE. (with the exception of Reception who get changed in school). Children are expected to wear their school sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece with their PE kit.

Additional Expectations

The wearing of jewellery is discouraged. If your child has pierced ears, these need to be studs and only one pair per child is allowed. For some activities such as P.E. /swimming earrings need to be removed or covered - your child must be able to do this themselves.

- Bracelets, bangles, necklaces, rings and smart watches are not allowed.
- Nail polish or any other make-up & mock tattoos are not allowed.
- Hair (at the point it is long enough) should be tied back at all times

Parents are requested to name all items of uniform.

Bicycles and Scooters

Please remind your child they must WALK with their bike or scooter when they are inside the blue gates. Bicycles and Scooters MUST NOT be ridden through the staff car park.

Dogs on School Site

If you bring your dog for a walk to school in the morning, or at home time, please wait at the end of the school drive in Knebley Crescent, rather than at the school gate.

Dogs, with the exception of our school dog and officially registered service dogs, are not permitted on our school site. This includes very small dogs that are hidden underneath or inside coats and buggies!

Before & After School Care

If your child is in Reception through to Year 6 and you would like to use our before or after school club please contact the school office.

Breakfast Club is open for drop offs between 7.30am and 8.30am for £4.00 per session, payable in cash on the day or in advance.

After school sessions are from 3.15pm until 5.00pm Monday to Friday, at a cost of £10 per session. Half sessions are currently available, these are from 3.15pm until 4.30pm or from after school sports club until 5.00pm at a cost of £7 per session. Late collections will be charged at £5 per 15 minutes.







Warwickshire Safeguarding

All Saints' Vision

School Parking - Keep Clear Zones

All parents and carers are urged to prioritise safe and considerate parking around school sites. Changing habits early helps set a positive example for children and contributes to a safer, calmer environment for everyone.

By parking legally and responsibly, families play a vital role in reducing risks, improving visibility, and ensuring that school journeys are safe and stress-free for all.

Uniformed officers will patrol schools throughout the County over the coming weeks to monitor compliance and raise awareness about the importance of safe and legal parking near schools.

Vehicles found in contravention of restrictions will be issued Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) of £70, reduced to £35 if paid within 14 days.

Why Enforcement Is Necessary

Despite regular reminders, some drivers continue to park on the restricted School Keep Clear zones and double yellow lines.

This behaviour can:

- · Reduce visibility for children and other road users
- Increase congestion
- · Create unsafe crossing conditions

School Keep Clear Zones:

Vehicles parked in these restricted areas during operational hours will be issued a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) of £70, reduced to £35 if paid within 14 days.



For continuity across all schools, all Zig Zag lines are enforceable between 8am and 5pm - Monday to Friday. The fixed time window provides clarity for drivers, improving compliance and reducing risk.



Parking on double yellow lines, which indicate no waiting at any time, will also be enforced. Drivers will receive a PCN of £70, also reduced to £35 if paid within 14 days.
