



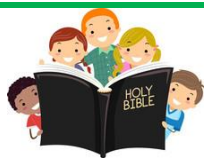

Key Stage 2 Edgbaston Cricket Programme

Bikeability Level 2 – Years 5 & 6

Bikeability Level 2 is coming soon for years 5 & 6, week beginning 23rd June. Bikeability now have a portal for providing consent for children to participate, so it really is first come first served. There are 24 places available to children across Years 5 & 6. 12 will participate Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, the other 12 will participate on Wednesday afternoon, Thursday and Friday mornings. If your child has already completed Level 2, please do not sign them up to do it again.

WHAT IS BIKEABILITY?

Bikeability is the national cycle training programme supported and funded by the Department for Transport. The course builds the skills and confidence of children who can already ride. Bikeability can not only make children better cyclists - potentially for the rest of their lives - but can help with general confidence and independent thinking. All of our Bikeability training is delivered by qualified, professional, DBS checked National Standard Instructors. Visit www.bikeability.org.uk for more information



Level 1 takes place in an off road environment and teaches riders how to control and master their bikes



Level 2 gives participants on-road experience in residential traffic to help them prepare to make short journeys by bicycle



Level 3 teaches individuals the skills to ride effectively on more complex roads and in further challenging traffic situations

FURTHER INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

This course develops the cycling skills and confidence of children who can already cycle. Please ask your school about Bikeability Balance and Bikeability Learn to Ride if your child can't already cycle. To benefit from Bikeability, your child must attend every session and practice what they learn after training. Bikeability skills and confidence will be lost without regular cycling. Bikeability engenders enthusiasm while building skills and confidence to cycle more safely, more often. Please support and encourage your child to continue cycling after training. Sign up will be on a first come first serve basis however a waiting list will be available. Due to course timings and ratios each session will be capped to a maximum of 12 riders

Terms & Conditions:

Please read the following information before completing and returning the consent slip to your child's school. I understand that:

1. I agree to my son/daughter taking part in cycle training
2. My son/daughter can already ride (may be refused if not)
3. The instructors may refuse to train my child if they deem his/her cycle to be unroadworthy
4. It remains my responsibility to ensure my child does not ride an unroadworthy bike and if I am in doubt as to whether a cycle is roadworthy, I should seek the advice of a professional mechanic
5. Instructors may at any time refuse to continue to train my child if his/her behaviour or cycling ability is deemed unsuitable
6. Northern Warwickshire Active will not be responsible for any injury or liable for any loss or damage to participant's cycles and other belongings.
7. I agree for my child to wear a helmet, which I will provide.
8. I consent to the Bikeability instructor 'adjusting' my child's helmet if required, however I confirm they are not responsible for the physical condition or appropriate fitting of the helmet
9. I understand that pupil data collected will be used to support the delivery and monitoring of training sessions/courses. See bikeability.org.uk/privacy-statement/ for further details.
10. I agree to encourage my child to practice between each session and after the completion of training.

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Attendance and Punctuality for week beginning 2nd June 2025

Please remember – if your child is unwell and unable to attend school, you must inform us at the very earliest opportunity, either by calling the office or sending a text message via our MyEd app, ideally before 9am. Please keep your child at home if they have a temperature of 38 or above. For sickness and diarrhoea, children must remain absent from school or nursery for 48 hours after the last episode.

Punctuality The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time. First thing in the morning is the most crucial time of the day when children settle in and find out what they will be doing that day. Arriving late for school can have a massive impact on your child's education and wellbeing.

- 343 minutes of learning time was lost due to children arriving late for school.

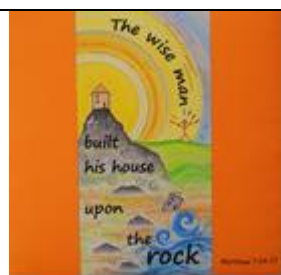
Well done to the whole school for all the lovely behaviour we have seen this week at Lunchtimes. All Saints has been 'Pom'tastic!

All Saints' Vision

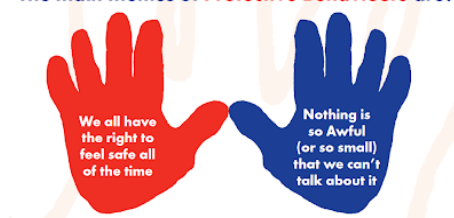

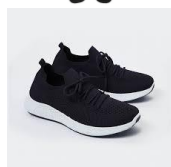

School Uniform

All children are expected to wear full school uniform. Our uniform consists of; grey bottoms (trousers, skirt, shorts, pinafore dress). A plain white polo shirt. A royal blue jumper or cardigan (with or without the school logo). Black, sensible shoes with fastenings the child can carry out themselves. (Tie their own laces). Jewellery is not to be worn in school, with the exception of one pair of small stud earrings that can be removed by the child for PE lessons.

Children who have after school sports clubs on days when they do not have PE, must bring their PE kit to school to change into.



PE kit

Children in years 1 to 6 are expected to wear their PE kit on PE days ONLY. On all other days they must wear their full school uniform as detailed above.

Children in Reception must wear their full school uniform every day and bring their PE kit into school to change in to and out of for their lessons.

Acceptable PE kit consists of:

A **PLAIN** white, round neck t-shirt;

A pair of **NON BRANDED** black shorts, joggers, leggings or skort;

A pair of trainers or pe pumps.

These must be worn with a school jumper or cardigan. Children **MUST NOT** wear hoodies to school in place of a jumper or cardigan. If children are wearing earrings, they must be able to remove them themselves.

Are you looking after someone else's child?

This could be Private Fostering. Private Fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old (or under 18 if disabled) goes to live with someone for 28 days or more by private arrangement with someone who is not a:

- parent
- close relative (brother, sister, aunt, uncle, grandparent or married step parent)
- guardian or a person with parental responsibility
