British Science Week

To celebrate British Science Week this week we have a fabulous, exciting day planned with a visit from real scientists today, **Monday 11**th **March**, beginning with a 'whole school assembly'.

Years 3 and 4 will have a workshop called **Detective Science**. **Years 5 and 6** will have a workshop called **Power Rangers**. Easter Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

Free Level 1 Scooter Training – Easter Holidays

Warwickshire County Council and Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership are offering FREE Level 1 Scootability training throughout Warwickshire during the Easter holidays, 25th – 29th March. We would be most grateful if you could share the below information, and attached poster, direct with parents/carers:

Warwickshire County Council and Warwickshire Road Safety Partners are offering free Scootability Level 1 training throughout Warwickshire during 25th - 29th March. Training is suitable for children aged 5 - 10 years and is being held at the following locations:

- Monday 25th March: Pingles Leisure Centre, Avenue Road, Nuneaton.
- Thursday 28th March (pm): Atherstone Memorial Hall, Long Street, Atherstone

During the course, children will learn essential skills and knowledge to help them scoot safely, including:

- learning about the parts of the scooter and the safety gear
- learning the basics of pushing, balancing and turning
- learning how to do slow and fast stops
- learning how to navigate stationary and moving obstacles
- learning how to do one handed signalling
- learning about road safety rules

All equipment, including scooters, helmets and pads, is provided and the sessions are suitable for children aged 5 to 10 years.

Booking is needed and spaces are limited.

Please note that this training is for push scooters only and not suitable for e-scooters. As a reminder, it is currently against the law to ride a privately owned e-scooter in any public place in the UK, this includes Warwickshire Country Parks.

Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

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Measles cases in West Midlands

There are still cases of measles. Please ensure you remain vigilant.

Currently Warwickshire has no confirmed cases, however we wanted to make you aware of the available resources:

We hope you find this information useful. If your child is unwell and you suspect it may be a case of measles, you MUST contact your GP. You child MUST remain away from school for a minimum of 4 full days.

If your child has not had their MMR Vaccination and you would now like them to, or you are unsure if they should, please contact your GP to get this booked in or to discuss the vaccination with a medical professional.
