## Attendance and Punctuality for week beginning 9th October 2023

**Punctuality** The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time. If the gate is locked and your child arrives through the main office doors, they are arriving late, and will receive a late mark, please avoid this and take a moment to explain to the office staff the reason.

## **Online Safety**

#### **Talking Tom and Friends**

The Talking Tom and friend's app is one of the most popular phone apps of 2023. The app allows you to interact with various different animated characters such as Tom a virtual, animated cat, Ben the dog or Becca the talking rabbit. You can pet and tickle, talk to and watch them repeat back to you what you say in a silly voice. The app can be great innocent fun and is primarily for children.

However, we have been made aware of several YouTube videos of others playing Talking Friends games that show abusive language, aggressive and threatening behaviour and expose our children to behaviours and choices that we do not want to see them repeat. Both Talking Friends and YouTube Kids can both be enjoyed safety but please remember that the best way to ensure your child's safety online is to stay curious in what they are watching and playing. Take a few minutes out to ask your child about what they are interacting with and set up parental controls to try and minimise the dangers.



### **Before & After School Care**

If your child is in Reception through to Year 6 and you would like to use our before or after school club please contact the school office. Breakfast Club is open for drop offs between 7.30am and 8.30am for £3.00 per session, payable in cash on the day or in advance. After school sessions are from 3.15pm until 5.30pm

Monday to Thursday, at a cost of £10 per session. \* until 5.15pm on a Friday for £9. Half sessions are currently available, these are from 3.15pm until 4.30pm or from after school sports club until 5.30pm at a cost of £6 per session. Late collections will be charged at £5 per 15 minutes. After school club must be booked and paid for in advance, via the app or in the office.
