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

## **School Dinners**

The cost of school dinners has not increased, they are £2.45 each day for a full meal, £12.25 for a week.

Please remember that all meals must be paid on the app where possible, in the morning or in advance on the **MONDAY** of the week you require. Copies of the dinner menu are available from the office and are also on the school website.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children receive free dinners regardless of their parents/carers financial position.

<u>Free School</u> Meals Parents and pupils entitled to free school meals do not have to reapply, but must inform the authority if there are any changes in their circumstances. ## <u>Swimming Lessons – Year 4 children</u>

As part of the National Curriculum children in Year 4 have swimming lessons at The Pingles Leisure Centre on Friday mornings. Children can come to school wearing their swimwear (Swimsuit or trunks, no bikinis) under their uniform, please ensure they bring: clean underwear, a towel, underwear and goggles if they wear them. Please ensure all children have any earrings removed and long hair is tied up.

## **Extra Curricular After School Clubs**

The new After School Clubs letters were sent home last Friday. All clubs have limited numbers, where we are over subscribed, we will put your child on the waiting list. Clubs available to children are: Years 1 & 2 – MultiSkills on Tuesday until 4pm, Years 3 & 4 Team Games on a Thursday until 4.15pm, Years 5 & 6 Netball on a Monday and Football on a Wednesday until 4.15pm.

Please be reminded, these clubs are not a childcare facility and may be withdrawn at very short notice. Please ensure you have a 'back up plan' in place so that your child can either be collected at 3:15pm or attend our paid After School Provision.

## **PE Lessons**

Children in all year groups have PE, regularly every week.

We are currently trialling children coming to school wearing their PE kit instead of uniform, currently in YEAR 3, YEAR 5 & YEAR 6 **ONLY**. Please ensure your child has their named PE kit in school, in a bag. This is hung on their peg, and can be kept in school for this half term and then taken home to be washed during October Half Term.

Please ensure children have their hair tied up for PE and any earrings removed. Nursery children DO NOT need a PE kit.

All children are expected to wear school uniform. This is:

- A sweatshirt £12, cardigan £13 or fleece £14.50, which can all be purchased from the school office via the MyEd APP.
- Grey trousers, skirt/pinafore. Grey shorts, blue and white checked or striped dresses in the summer.
- White polo shirt, long sleeved white shirt or blouse.
- BLACK SHOES flat & sensible that children can fasten themselves.

## **Reception application 2024 workshops**

Do you have a child born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020? If so, you need to be applying for a Primary school place for Reception this November ready for September 2024.

The application process opens on **1 November 2023** and the deadline to apply for a Reception school place is **15 January 2024.** If you apply by this date, you will receive your child's school offer on **National Offer Day (17 April 2024).** 

You are much less likely to be offered a place at your preferred school if you apply late as local schools fill quickly.

You need to apply online on the Warwickshire Parent Portal.

Our Pastoral team, Mrs Lusty and Miss Rouse are providing workshops for parents who would like some support with this process.

All parents of children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020 are welcome to attend the following sessions;

Tuesday 5th December 1:30 - 3:10

**Tuesday 12th December 9:00 - 11:30** 

Please bring with you suitable proof of address such as

- Council Tax bill for the current financial year
- signed and dated tenancy agreement

You are much less likely to be offered a place at your preferred school if you apply late as local schools fill quickly.

You need to apply online on the Warwickshire Parent Portal.

The first up is a reminder of the **FREE 'Smoothwall's Online Safety Hub'**. Did any of you find it useful over the summer? For those of you who haven't managed to look at it yet, the SOS Hub is designed to give parents access to up to date digital safety information, app reviews from digital safety experts, and in-depth information on popular social media and gaming platforms. So you can no longer feel out of depth when it comes to what your children are exposed to online. Follow the link

Second up is Qustodio. This gives you the ability to monitor two household devices for the year for free.

## **Before & After School Care**

If your child is in Reception through to Year 6 and you would like to use our before or after school club please contact the school office.

Breakfast Club is open for drop offs between 7.30am and 8.30am for £3.00 per session, payable in cash on the day or in advance.

After school sessions are from 3.15pm until 5.30pm Monday to Thursday, at a cost of £10 per session. \* until 5.15pm on a Friday for £9. Half sessions are currently available, these are from 3.15pm until 4.30pm or from after school sports club until 5.30pm at a cost of £6 per session. Late collections will be charged at £5 per 15 minutes.

After school club must be booked and paid for in advance, via the app or in the office. # LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the case of Platt v Isle of Wight Council which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time. The parents of children of compulsory school age are required to ensure that they attend school on a regular basis. The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

Head Teachers retain the ability to authorise leave in accordance with the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006. When considering such requests for a leave of absence, the school are obliged to act within the law. Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application. If the leave is granted, head teachers are able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for.

It is for the Head Teacher to decide what is 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s).

All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Attendance, Compliance and Enforcement Service of Warwickshire County Council

It is important to note, Fixed Penalty Notices are issued to <u>each parent of each absent child</u>, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means <u>each</u> parent will receive 2 invoices in the amount of £120 each, totalling £240 for both children, this is reduced to £60 per child if paid within 21 days).

Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996.

Fixed Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices.
