Whole School Attendance: 91.6% The school & national target is 96%

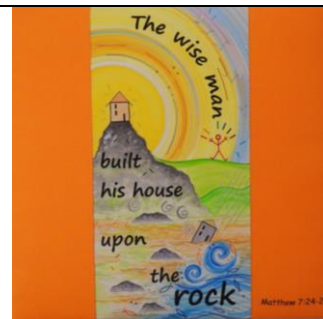
Punctuality The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time.

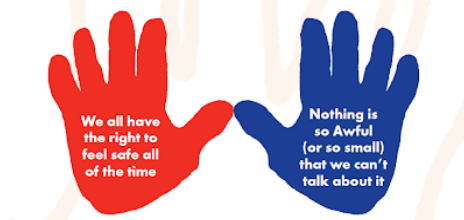

Nursery Children – Reception 2024 places

Parents and carers who applied by the deadline of 15th January, you will receive your child's school offer on National Offer Day, 16 April 2024.

On this day, Warwickshire County Council send you the name of the school that your child has been offered for September 2024.

You do not need to accept this offer. Instead, you should wait for the school to contact you so that they can send you any details of transition or induction.

Your offer letter will tell you how you can refuse the offer. If you do not refuse the offer, the records will show that the offer has been accepted.

If your child has not been offered a place at one or more of your higher preferred schools, or any of the schools you applied for, this will be because the school(s) received more applications than there were places available and other children met the admission criteria more closely than your child. However, your child will have been added to the waiting list(s) for those schools.

If your child will be attending All Saints, you do not need to do anything, if your child is going to another school, please notify the school office so that your nursery records can be sent off.

Should I keep my child off school?



Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Measles cases in West Midlands

There are still cases of measles. Please ensure you remain vigilant.

Currently Warwickshire has no confirmed cases, however we wanted to make you aware of the available resources:

We hope you find this information useful. If your child is unwell and you suspect it may be a case of measles, you MUST contact your GP. Your child MUST remain away from school for a minimum of 4 full days.

If your child has not had their MMR Vaccination and you would now like them to, or you are unsure if they should, please contact your GP to get this booked in or to discuss the vaccination with a medical professional.
